"Wondrous Doors"

Within the Chinese wisdom teachings there exist wondrous, secret doorways through which one can enter into other dimensions. Like acupuncture points, these hidden doorways exist in the fabric of both space and time. Feng Shui knowledge is used to locate these extraordinary conduits in space, and Chinese Astrology to find them in time. By combining the two, "being at the right place at the right time" the doors line up and open. If one is silent, focused and receptive, "doing the right thing," great insights can flow through from inner planes. Intuition is heightened.

In the old Chinese calendar, the Chinese Masters created an annual cycle of 360 days to combine celestial time, human time and earth time. They found there are ten celestial divisions (based on the yin and yang aspects of each of the 5 elements) and twelve earthly divisions (symbolized by the familiar 12 animals.) These two cycles move together like gears and at certain points they interlock and create energy nodes, or openings where the qi energy is very yin or receptive. This phenomena is usually applied to the well known 60 year cycle. (see newsletter Dec.. '07) This interlocking of cycles brought us the yang metal (white) Tiger energies for the year 2010.

In the inner, secret teachings, the ten celestial divisions which are called "heavenly stems" can also represent the ten months in a heavenly year. The twelve earthly divisions which are called "earthly branches" can also represent the twelve months in an earthly year.



There is a “pre-partum” hidden lunar universe of ten months (where time is condensed within the womb) and a postpartum, outer solar universe of twelve months. This is the reason a person in China is considered one year old when he or she is born, although only ten months have passed.

By combining the lunar year (10 months) and the solar year (12 months) a year of 24 (fifteen day) cycles is created. At the beginning of each of these 15 day cycles an energy node (jie qi) or “dragon hole” into other time dimensions appears. These “wondrous” doorways are also associated with the subtle changes in the weather.

I have listed the dates for 2010 below. The spring equinox (March 21st), summer solstice (June 21st), fall equinox (Sept .23) and winter solstice (Dec. 22nd) are considered the most powerful doorways.
